California Correctional Health Care Services (CCHCS) provides care that includes medical, dental and mental health services to California’s prison inmate population at all 35 California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) institutions statewide.

Facts & Figures

- Annual inmate health care costs: \$17,698
- There have been no preventable deaths since 2012
- The number of possible preventable deaths has trended downward since 2007.
- Acuity of inmate-patients (as of September 2017):
 - 15,682 high-medical acuity
 - 46,058 medium-medical acuity
 - 69,809 low-medical acuity
- Acuity of inmate-patients for our 35 institutions
 - 15,587 high-medical acuity
 - 45,244 medium-medical acuity
 - 61,911 low-medical acuity
- Current prison overcrowding rate (as of December 2017) – 131.7 percent.
