Once you have taken this examination, you may not retake it for **six (6) months**.

If you are personally delivering your application, you must do so between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Do not submit applications to the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR).

Only applications with an original signature will be accepted.

Dates printed on mobile barcodes or equivalent mobile print technology shall not be considered postmarks and, as such, are not acceptable proof of the date an application was filed.

Applications MUST include "to" and "from" dates (month/day/year), time base, civil service class title(s), and range (if applicable) for all work experience. College course information MUST include title, number of semester or quarter units, name of institution, completion dates, and degree (if applicable). Applications received without this information may have delays in processing and/or may be rejected.

If you require special testing arrangements due to a verified disability or medical condition, please contact the department listed in the Contact Information section of this bulletin.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements as stated on this exam bulletin to be accepted into the examination. Part-time or full-time jobs, regardless of whether paid or volunteer positions, and inside or outside California state service will count toward experience.

Radiologic Technologist, Correctional Facility

Possession of a current valid certificate as a certified Radiologic Technologist in diagnostic radiologic technology issued by the California State Department of Health

Services. (Applicants who are in the process of securing such certification will be admitted to the examination but must possess such certificate before they will be considered eligible for appointment.) **And**

Either I

Two years of experience, including training in radiologic techniques and methods, under an accredited medical radiologist. (Successful completion of the work required for a graduate nurse may be substituted for one year of this required experience and training.)

Or II

Education: Successful completion of a <u>two-year training program in radiologic technology</u> <u>approved by the Council on Medical Education and Hospitals of the American Medical Association,</u> in collaboration with the American College of Radiology.

Special Personal Characteristics: Tact, alertness, vision sufficient to perform the essential functions of the job; empathetic understanding of patients of a State correctional facility; willingness to work in a State correctional facility; emotional stability; patience; and keenness of observation.

Special Physical Characteristics: Persons appointed to this position must be reasonably expected to have and maintain sufficient strength, agility, and endurance to perform during stressful (physical, mental, and emotional) situations encountered on the job without compromising their health and well-being or that of their fellow employees or that of incarcerated patients.

Assignments may include sole responsibility for the supervision of incarcerated patients and/or the protection of personal and real property.

Additional Desirable Qualifications: Education equivalent to graduation from high school and a Therapeutic Radiologic Technologist certificate.

Applicants possessing the required license/certificate at the time of application must show the number, title, and expiration date on their Examination Application (Std. Form 678).

OUT OF CLASS EXPERIENCE: A completion of an "out-of-class (OOC) assignment memorandum", dated within one year of assignment completion, is required to use OOC experience to meet the minimum qualifications for examination purposes. Employees may obtain this documentation from their Classification and Pay Analyst or institutional Personnel Liaison. OOC experience without the required documentation cannot be considered for examination purposes.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

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Radiologic Technologist, Correctional Facility

A Radiologic Technologist, Correctional Facility under direction, instructs and prepares patients for radiologic examinations; determines the most suitable anatomical posture and positions and shields patients appropriately; positions and operates stationary or portable radiologic machines and takes X-rays for a variety of body structures; processes, develops, makes copies, and fixes X-ray films; prepares solutions for processing films; assists in fluoroscopic work; under supervision, makes copies of unusual cases and retains in a teaching file; maintains equipment and quarters; keeps records and files; makes reports as needed; maintains order and supervises the conduct of incarcerated patients and maintains safety of persons and property; prevents escape of and injury by persons committed to the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to themselves or others or to property; maintains security of working areas and work materials; inspects premises and searches incarcerated patients for contraband, such as weapons or illegal drugs; and does other related work.

Positions exist statewide.

EXAMINATION SCOPE

This examination consists of the following components:

Education and Experience Rating – Weighted 100% of the final score.

The examination will consist solely of an **Education and Experience Rating.** For this reason, it is especially important to include all of your education and/or experience related to the "Minimum Qualifications" and "Position Description" listed on this bulletin in your application. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be received.

Applicants who meet the minimum qualifications will be sent their scores approximately 2-3 weeks from the date the application is received.

In addition to evaluating applicants' relative knowledge, skills, and ability, as demonstrated by quality and breadth of education and/or experience, emphasis in each exam component will be measuring competitively, relative job demands, each applicant's:

Knowledge of:

- 1. Modern radiologic equipment and techniques;
- 2. Regional and gross anatomy of the human body;
- 3. Standardized radiologic clinical procedures;
- 4. Thorough knowledge of the hazards of radiologic materials and the safety precautions required:
- 5. The operation and care of modern radiologic equipment;
- 6. The ordering and storing of supplies.

Ability to:

1. Communicate effectively at a level required for successful job performance;

- 2. Administer emergency aid for shock;
- 3. Prepare solution used in processing X-ray film and process film;
- 4. Keep simple records, file film correctly, and compile reports;
- 5. Follow directions;
- 6. Analyze situations accurately and take effective action;
- 7. Establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with others.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

A departmental, open spot eligible list for the Radiologic Technologist, Correctional Facility classification will be established for:

California Correctional Health Care Services

The names of **successful** competitors will be merged onto the eligible list in order of final score regardless of examination date. Eligibility expires **twelve (12) months** after it is established. Applicants must then retake the examination to reestablish eligibility.

Veterans' Preference will be granted for this examination. In accordance with Government Codes 18973.1 and 18973.5, whenever any veteran, or widow or widower of a veteran achieves a passing score on an open examination, he or she shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligible list.

Veterans' status is verified by the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR). Information on this program and the <u>Veterans' Preference Application</u> (Std. Form 1093) is available online. Additional information on veteran benefits is available at the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Career credits are not granted in examinations administered on an open basis.

Employment History: Employment dates, job titles, organization names and addresses, names of supervisors or persons who can verify your job responsibilities, and phone numbers of persons listed above.

Education: School names and addresses, degrees earned, dates attended, courses taken (verifiable on a transcript), persons or office who can verify education, and phone numbers of persons or offices listed above. If you are using the education requirement to meet the Minimum Qualifications (MQs) for this exam, please attach a copy of all your unofficial transcripts that show the completion of the required education. Applicants who completed their education outside of the United States (with foreign degrees/transcripts) must obtain and submit verification of United States course/degree equivalency at the time you are submitting your exam. GENERAL INFORMATION

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Examination and/or Employment Application (Std. Form 678) forms are available at CalHR, local offices of the Employment Development Department, and through your **CalCareer Account**.

If you meet the requirements stated on this examination bulletin, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirements does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination described in this bulletin will be rated against a predetermined job-related rating, and all applicants who pass will be ranked according to their score.

CCHCS reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service, if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all applicants will be notified.

General Qualifications: Applicants must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgement, the ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) servicewide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on the bulletin.

High School Equivalence: Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Education Development (GED) Test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college-level work;

3) certification from the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the competitor is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; or 4) for clerical and accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis.
